"As you may be aware, a referendum that is on the general election ballot for this November is asking voters to approve or reject what is known as an Equal Rights Amendment to the New York State Constitution. While some of the language of the proposed amendment is unobjectionable, the New York State Catholic Conference, which represents the Bishops of New York State in public policy matters, strongly opposes the referendum for important reasons. Once again K of C Trinity Council #4618 has kicked off our 13th Annual Fund Drive for "Coats for Kids" amongst our membership. This annual fund drive to support "Coats for Kids" runs through September, October and the first 2 weeks of November.

Since 2012, the Webster Knights of Columbus have run this fund drive each Fall and have been able to purchase 3576 NEW winter coats over 12 years that we have done this. Holy Trinity's Ministry Corner

The Holy Trinity cemetery association was created on October 25th, 1865. In 1866 land was purchased north of the church. The first burial was in February, 1867 when Elizabeth Miller, age 36, was laid to rest. Over the years our cemetery has seen several expansions. Recently a formal entranceway was built. Our latest addition is a Sacred Heart statue and benches - a perfect spot to view the entire campus, pray and remember those who were part of Holy Trinity parish over the last 163 years. The cemetery is now 6 acres of land with over 2,000 burials including 3 priests and 4 deacons. How blessed we are to have this holy ground.


