2024/2025 CATHOLIC MINISTRIES APPEAL

My dear family of Holy Trinity Church.

The Diocese of Rochester (therefore, Holy Trinity Church) is starting the Catholic Ministries Appeal this weekend for 2024-2025. "Begun more than forty years ago in 1981-1982 as the "Thanks Giving Appeal," the purpose of the CMA is to raise money to support diocesan-wide ministries and outreach. The fund was renamed in 2006 to better reflect the appeal's intent: helping to support crucial outreach and ministries of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Rochester and the mission of each of our parishes" (https://www.dor.org/wp-content/uploads/CMA_FAQ_2024-2025.pdf).

This year's mission theme is "Extending Christ's Mission through the Catholic Ministries Appeal." This theme encourages us in our call to be modern disciples to teach, serve, and spread the Gospel message. This theme is especially fitting as we enter the third year of our three-year national Eucharistic Revival."

Last year, our parish family of Holy Trinity did extraordinary work, almost achieving last year's goal proposed by the Diocese of Rochester. Last year, our CMA goal was \$185,000 dollars, and we were \$1,160 short. The Diocese of Rochester made up that difference from excess amounts donated by other parishes so Holy Trinity Church did not need to pay that amount from parish funds. Even though we could not make the CMA goal, the CMA committee of the Diocese was impressed with our participation rates in CMA. Any participation in this campaign is very important, even if it is a small one.

All of this was possible because of you. Your participation and hard work during the 2023-2024 CMA reflects your commitment to the Lord and our parish family of Holy Trinity Church. I ask you to continue your donation and, if it is possible for you, to increase it. I hope we can reach the 2024-2025 goal for CMA as soon as possible, hopefully by the end of this year, by Christmas.

Our goal for CMA has increased for this year. **Our goal for 2024 – 2025 is \$192,000** representing an increase of \$7,000 dollars.

You and I will receive a letter from Bishop Matano asking you to participate in this campaign. My wish is that each member in our great family of Holy Trinity Church participates in this campaign. I know that you have a wonderful and beautiful spirit of service and generosity. Let us work together to achieve our goal for CMA.

Remember, The Parish that we dream is the Parish that I help to build.


All are invited to bring their pets to Holy Trinity on Saturday, October 5 to be blessed in honor of St. Francis' feast day (October 4) because of his love for animals as expressed in his *Canticle of Creatures*.

Who is St. Francis of Assisi?

St. Francis of Assisi was born in the 12th century, lived in Italy, and founded the men's Order of Friars Minor, the women's Order of St. Clare, and the Third Order of Saint Francis for men and women not able to live the lives of itinerant preachers. Francis is one of the most venerated religious figures in history. He is remembered for his generosity to the poor, his willingness to minister to the lepers, and for his love for animals and nature. He is the Catholic Church's patron saint of animals and the environment.

Donations Collected for Pets in Need

The Feast of St. Francis of Assisi provides a Christian Service opportunity for our children to help families in our community with pets in need. All donations collected at our event will be distributed to local families through the Pet Food Pantry of Webster. All are invited to MAKE & PRAY the WORLD MISSION ROSARY with our children and youth on Monday, October 7 on the celebration of Our Lady of the Rosary (Mary!).

What is the World Mission Rosary?

In 1951, Venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen created the World Mission Rosary. Each decade of the World Mission Rosary represents a different area of the world where missionaries continue to share the Good News of Jesus.

- GREEN symbolizes the forests and grasslands of AFRICA
- BLUE is for the ocean surrounding the ISLANDS OF THE PACIFIC
- WHITE symbolizes EUROPE, home of the Holy Father, shepherd of the world
- **RED** shows the fire of faith that brought the first missionaries to the **AMERICAS**
- **YELLOW** is for the morning light of the East, symbolizing **ASIA**.

To pray the World Mission Rosary, reflect on each area of the world according to the particular color bead described above at the time you announce each Mystery. When you have completed the World Mission Rosary, you have given the World a big hug!

MAKE YOUR VERY OWN WORLD MISSION ROSARY

We will begin at 6:00pm in Trinity Hall as we guide our children (and anyone who would like to participate) in making a World Mission Rosary of their very own. We will then proceed up to the main church at 6:45pm to pray this special mediation together as we join our voices together with children from around the world as part of the Missionary Childhood Association (MCA).

The MCA is established in more than 130 countries in the world promoting mission and global awareness among school age children. MCA is unique to other organizations that assist children in that its primary aim is to encourage children to share their faith with children in the developing world through their prayers, personal sacrifices and financial offerings.

Our World Mission Rosary event is just one way that we look forward to incorporating Missionary Discipleship into catechesis as we strive to raise the level of mission consciousness among our students, teachers, and our whole parish community.
